# **Get involved - Patient and Public Voice Partners** on SW Joint Commissioning Committee

NHS England South West (NHSE SW) is offering a rare opportunity to influence the thinking and decision making of senior healthcare leaders and decision makers across the whole of the South West by supporting the transition of responsibility for commissioning specialised services from NHS England to ICBs over the coming years.

NHSE SW are looking for two people with a genuine interest in participation and an ability to constructively engage and share your views with senior level professionals to join the joint committee. Ideally, they will have previous experience of influencing change and taking part in high level and strategic discussions.

#### More details:

- The role will last for a year, renewable for up to 3 years.
- Meetings will be held on a bi-monthly basis usually online, but occasional travel for face to face meetings may be required. Meetings should typically last 1.5 hours except in exceptional circumstances.

# UPDATE: IMHN in One Weston, Worle & Villages Locality Partnership

Two IMHN lived experience representatives in OWWV have been involved effectively from the beginning of the development of its new Integrated Mental Health Team (IMHT) – showing great co-production between the locality partnership (LP) and the two IMHN reps. The OWWV IMHT is the first to go live in Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire (BNSSG) Integrated Care System, with its 6 LPs, and is helping to fill the gap between Primary care, including GPs and NHS Talking Therapies, and Secondary mental health care; this is called for by the England-wide Community Mental Health Framework.

The reps have participated in many LP meetings, helped interview for IMHT staff, given a talk to approximately 200 people from BNSSG's Healthier Together partnership on Weston-super-Mare's Grand Pier and have now been joined by a third rep, strengthening the team ready for the future challenges.
